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Dinner With Jesus: Faith and Forgiveness Luke 7:36-50

Series Summary

“Dinner with Jesus” invites us to take a seat at the table with Jesus as He engages us over meals in New Testament history. We learn how to model the grace and compassion of Jesus as we reach out to modern day “tax collectors and untouchables.” We discover how meaningful worship, praying in expectation, and learning from failure will fuel our spiritual growth.

Main Text

Luke 7:36-50 (ESV) – ³⁶ One of the Pharisees asked him to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee’s house and reclined at table. ³⁷ And behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee’s house, brought an alabaster flask of ointment, ³⁸ and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the ointment.

³⁹ Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, “If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner.” ⁴⁰ And Jesus answering said to him, “Simon, I have something to say to you.” And he answered, “Say it, Teacher.” ⁴¹ “A certain moneylender had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. ⁴² When they could not pay, he cancelled the debt of both. Now which of them will love him more?” ⁴³ Simon answered, “The one, I suppose, for whom he cancelled the larger debt.” And he said to him, “You have judged rightly.”

Big Idea – Faith is the Key that Unlocks the Door of Forgiveness

Three Facts About Faith and Forgiveness

Fact #1 – Redemption: Your Restoration is Not Found in Your Strength...It is Obtained in Your Surrender

Fact #2 – Clarity: Your Conviction is Given Value When His Vision Becomes Your Reality
