Series Summary

The Book of Psalms is one of the most beloved books in the entire Bible. It is in these chapters that we find peace for troubled hearts, courage for moments of fear, strength for times of weakness, and encouragement for everyday living. This series will challenge you to read through the Psalms and also pray through the Psalms as you grow in faithfulness to the Lord.

Main Text

Psalm 100:1-5 (ESV) – ¹ Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! ² Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! ³ Know that the Lord, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. ⁴ Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name! ⁵ For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.

Big Idea – Praise the Lord Daily with a Spirit of Joy and Thanksgiving

Three Prayers of Psalm 100

Background

Psalm 100 Title – A Psalm of Thanksgiving

Prayer #1 – Lord, Stir My Heart to Call to You With Joy and Jubilation

Psalm 100:1-2 (ESV) – ¹ Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! ² Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing!

Prayer #2 – Lord, Give Me an Attitude of Gratitude to Daily Thank You for Your Provision

Psalm 100:3 (ESV) – ³ Know that the Lord, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

Prayer #3 – Lord, Give Me a Heart of Humility to Enter Your Presence With Praise and Thanksgiving

Psalm 100:4-5 (ESV) – ⁴ Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name! ⁵ For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.
