During this time, we understand that not every individual will feel like coming to a live service in person due to the Coronavirus, especially if an individual is in a high-risk category. Our desire is to continue to provide a place of prayer and worship that is needed for a time like this and we continue to encourage each individual to exercise wisdom and discernment. This weekend will bring several changes regarding our worship service and regular activities to address concerns regarding the Coronavirus.

- First, the facility will be sanitized and disinfected before and after first service.
- Second, there will be only two entrances open. The front doors and the rear doors under the carport.
- Third, there will be no Sunday School classes. During this time period, volunteers will clean the church before the second service to sanitize and disinfect the facility once again.
- Fourth, each service will be recorded and can be seen live on our website (<https://www.sullivanfcc.org/live/>) or you can join us on Facebook. You can also listen to the 10:30 a.m. service live on the radio at 95.3 WNDI.

- Fifth, all extra classes and activities on Sunday night and through the week will be cancelled for the next several weeks.

Please note that out of consideration for your fellow Christian brothers and sisters, if you or any member of your household has been recently sick, we ask that you prayerfully consider staying home and watching the service online or listening on the radio during this season of uncertainty.

We will continue to keep you updated on any changes and we continue to pray for the safety and well-being of all, especially in those areas that have already been hard-hit by the coronavirus outbreak. May God continue to fill you with peace and hope, in the midst of an anxious season for our country and our world!
